



him aware of the access issue at that time. But he went on to say that just because no one had let him know about the situation, that did not mean the county was in any way obligated to build him a driveway.

"I guess the bottom line is, we can't help you," Malm said to Havens. "But it was worth a try," Luck was quick to add.

Noll told the board that the Road and Bridge Department was chip-and-sealing West Lake Road and that the project would be completed the next day. He went on to say he was thankful for the efforts of all the men who were doing the work, especially in light of the heat.

Ledbetter made the comment that the milling of the road and the subsequent patching done to it had resulted in a "significant improvement" in its condition.
