




The statement read, "This will include the request to refrain from displaying the Confederate flag at our facilities and NASCAR events."

The move follows NASCAR's statement last week reiterating that the flag is banned from official use at its events. And it comes ahead of Sunday's race at Daytona International Speedway — the first in the South since the mid-June attack that left nine track churchgoers dead in Gaston. The suspect had embraced Confederate symbols, including the battle flag

said "Going forward, we'll really have to look at where that other flag goes, because it doesn't have a place in our sport and we've got to take a thoughtful process on how we get to that place."

ISC, a sister company of NASCAR, owns 18 facilities that signed the statement. SMI, the Britton Smith-owned rival to ISC, had its eight properties listed as supporting NASCAR. Indianapolis Motor Speedway was among the independents taking part. Drivers including Dale Earnhardt Jr. have been

of fans on the sprawling properties. France stressed that the flag, while part of NASCAR's roots as a series for old bootleggers, is not indicative of what the sport represents and he had hinted that the series was working with the industry on options.

"Obviously, we have our roots in the South, there are events in the South, it's part of our history like it is for the country," France told The Associated Press. "But it needs to be just that, part of our history. It isn't part of our future."

The relevant inquiry should be what information did former St. Louis Cardinals employees steal from the Cardinals organization prior to joining the Houston Astros, and who in the Astros organization authorized, consented to, or benefited from that request. Behavior," said Williams, who said he returned a message left asking additional comment from Jeff Luhnow, who headed the Cardinals' scouting and player development department and was a key proponent of the team's Redbird database, was hired as the Astros general manager in December 2011. At

least one former Cardinals employee — Sig Mejdal, a former NASA employee and analytics expert — joined Luhnow in Houston.

Asked about Williams' comment, Astros general counsel Giles Kibbe declined comment. "We look forward to the FBI conducting their investigation," he said.

The hack was first reported in June 2014 after some of the Trade Talk was published online. The Astros rely heavily on analytics in their evaluation of players and use an online database called Ground Control to house proprietary information.

The FBI has declined to confirm it is investigating the Cardinals. But a person familiar with the investigation has told the AP that federal authorities are looking at whether members of

the team were to blame for what Major League Baseball called a "breach" of the Astros database. There has been no indication of how many employees might be under investigation and any motive for the hack remains unclear.

Last month, Martin said Cardinals Chairman Bill DeWitt Jr. and Mozellak were not targets of the investigation. DeWitt also used the term "roguish behavior" last month in a news conference in which the team confirmed the investigation.

Mozellak said Jared Olson of baseball operations would handle Correa's day to day operations, but added "anything high level will come through my office."
