Legislative Update

Joe Mandala/KBI – HB2077 was moved to shell of HB2019. Because they couldn't move 2077 because it was still an active bill into conference, but 2019 was already conference tabled. So, they move the contents from 2077 into a conference table, bill, which was 2019.

The Kansas criminal justice information system shall report any cybersecurity incident in accordance with rules and regulations adopted by the Kansas criminal justice information system committee pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5704. Such entities would also be exempt from reporting incidents to the KISO if they are not connected to any other State of Kansas information system,

and the Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI) would be required to notify the KISO of reports it receives per rules and regulations adopted by the KCJIS Committee within 12 hours of receiving such reports. The bill would specify that information provided related to such an incident could only be shared with those responsible for response and defense activities in service of state information systems, or those requested to assist in such activities. The information pertaining to the incident would not be subject to the provisions of the Kansas Open Records Act until July 1, 2028.

If passed the bill will take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.

KHP will have a pre-set meeting on April 17th and will discuss the new FBI policy changes and how this legislation will impact the CJIS network and community.

Committee legal council will be contacted on steps required to get registered with the Sec. of State and what needs to be done to start the development of KCJIS cyber activity reporting requirement under this new legislation.

Next meeting will be in-person at the conference on Monday, 15May.
